Atamisque Malbec:

“The 2011 Malbec is produced from low-yielding, almost centenary vines in La Consulta, in the south of the Uco Valley aged for 14 months in new French oak barrels. Has integrated oak, depth of fruit, good balance and freshness, with notes of ripe plums, violets and blueberries with a spicy touch and medium to full-bodied, ripe and long. This is a great Malbec at a great price, drinkable, but should also age well. 25,000 bottles produced. Highly recommended. Drink now-2018. I was pleasantly surprised by the wines from Atamisque, a winery in Tupungato with 70 hectares of vineyards purchased in 2006 by a Frenchman, John Du Monceau”.
